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CORRIGENDUM OF OBVIOUS INACCURACIES in the text of the Invitation to tender for the award of the rights to use radio frequencies for providing a public communications network in the 800 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2600 MHz bands

The Czech Telecommunication Office (hereinafter the „Office“) was notified, in relation to the publication of the text of the Invitation to Tender for the award of the rights to use radio frequencies for providing a public communications network in the 800 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2600 MHz bands (hereinafter the “ITT”), that there are obvious inaccuracies in the text of the ITT. For avoidance of doubt, the Office publishes the following corrigendum relating to the following obvious inaccuracies in the text of the ITT:

- A typing error in the cross reference in definitions of the National Roaming Obligation and of the Wholesale Offer Obligation in Chapter 1 of the ITT,
- A correction of inconsistency between the text of the ITT (Chapter 7.6.5) and Appendix 4 – Auction Rules (Chapter 4.2.3, point C).

The conditions of the tender for the award of the rights to use radio frequencies for providing a public communications network in the 800 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2600 MHz bands are not changed by this corrigendum of obvious inaccuracies.

The corrigendum concerns the following points:

- 1. A correction of the text of the ITT, Chapter 1, where there is a typing error in the definition of the National Roaming Obligation and of the Wholesale Offer Obligation, namely in the reference to Chapter 5.6 of the ITT instead of Chapter 5.7 of the ITT.**

1.1. The original wording of the ITT, Chapter 1:

- **National Roaming Obligation** – obligation of the Applicant in accordance with the conditions specified in Chapter 5.6 to provide a Rightful Claimant for National Roaming an access to its (the Applicant’s) public communications network(s) operated by the Applicant with use of the radio frequencies allocated on the basis of this tender as well as with the use of the radio frequencies already held in the 900 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2100 MHz bands.
- **Wholesale Offer Obligation** – obligation of the Applicant in accordance with the conditions specified in Chapter 5.6 to provide access to its (the Applicant’s) public communications network operated by the Applicant with use of the radio frequencies acquired in this tender, to a claimant who requests to be provided with such access for the purposes of providing its own electronic communications services via the Applicant’s network.

1.2. The correct wording of the text of the ITT, Chapter 1:

- **National Roaming Obligation** – obligation of the Applicant in accordance with the conditions specified in Chapter 5.7 to provide a Rightful Claimant for National Roaming an access to its (the Applicant's) public communications network(s) operated by the Applicant with use of the radio frequencies allocated on the basis of this tender as well as with the use of the radio frequencies already held in the 900 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2100 MHz bands.
- **Wholesale Offer Obligation** – obligation of the Applicant in accordance with the conditions specified in Chapter 5.7 to provide access to its (the Applicant's) public communications network operated by the Applicant with use of the radio frequencies acquired in this tender, to a claimant who requests to be provided with such access for the purposes of providing its own electronic communications services via the Applicant's network.

2. A corrigendum of the text of the ITT, Chapter 7.6.5, third bullet, where there is a missing possibility to submit a bid at other two price levels, as compared to the text of the Auction Rules and where for the last four price levels there is a missing reference to the price determined pursuant to Chapter 7.6.8 of the ITT and Chapter 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules, respectively, as a base price to which a percentage of the minimum price of the Auction Block can be added:

2.1. The original wording of the ITT, Chapter 7.6.5, third bullet:

- If the Highest Bid Holder is not identified because the Highest Bid withdrawal right has been used according to Chapter 7.6.8, the Auction Participants may submit a bid for the given Auction Block at 3 price levels, determined by the Electronic Auction System. These are as follows:
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid increased by 10% of the minimum price of the Auction Block;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid increased by 20% of the minimum price of the Auction Block.

2.2. The correct wording of the ITT, Chapter 7.6.5, third bullet:

- If the Highest Bid Holder is not identified because the Highest Bid withdrawal right has been used according to Chapter 7.6.8, the Auction Participants may submit a bid for the given Auction Block at 5 price levels, determined by the Electronic Auction System. These are as follows:
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8 increased by 2,5% of the minimum price of the Auction Block;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8 increased by 5% of the minimum price of the Auction Block;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8 increased by 10% of the minimum price of the Auction Block;
 - Price of the withdrawn Highest Bid or price determined in accordance with Chapter 7.6.8 increased by 20% of the minimum price of the Auction Block.

2.3. The original wording of the Auction Rules, Chapter 4.2.3, point C:

- C. If the Holder of the highest bid fails to be determined as a result of the application of the right of Withdrawal of the Standing Bid, the Bidders will be able to submit a bid for the given block at 5 price levels set by the EAS on the level of:
- the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid plus 2.5% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid plus 5% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid plus 10% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid plus 20 % of the Auction Lot minimum price.

2.4. The correct wording of the Auction Rules, Chapter 4.2.3, point C:

- C. If the Holder of the highest bid fails to be determined as a result of the application of the right of Withdrawal of the Standing Bid, the Bidders will be able to submit a bid for the given block at 5 price levels set by the EAS on the level of:
- the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules increased by 2.5% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules increased by 5% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules increased by 10% of the Auction Lot minimum price;
 - the price of the withdrawn Standing Bid or the price set as per Section 4.3.6 of the Auction Rules increased by 20 % of the Auction Lot minimum price.
